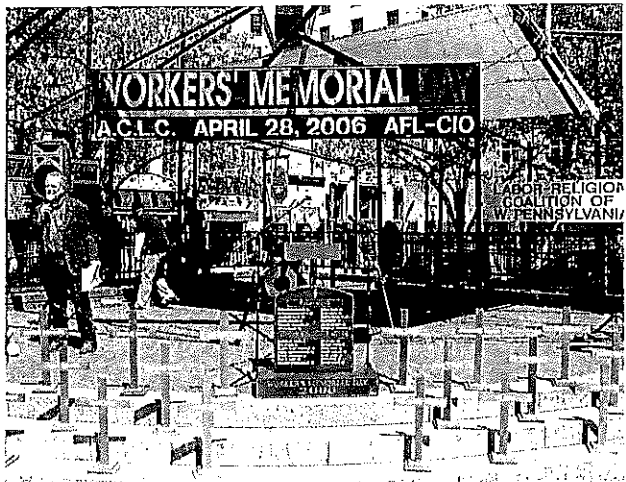

On April 30, 2007 the Allegheny County Labor Council, AFL-CIO will once again observe Workers' Memorial Day to remember workers killed or injured on the job and to renew the fight for strong safety and health protections.

In 2005, **5,702** workers were killed by injuries on the job, another **50,000** die each year from occupational diseases.

More than three decades ago, Congress passed the Occupational Safety and Health Act and Mine Safety and Health Act, promising every worker the right to a safe job. Unions and our allies have fought hard to make that promise a reality—winning protections that have saved hundreds of thousands of lives our fight for safer workplaces has become harder as the Bush administration has worked with business supporters to overturn or block needed worker protections. In the Congress, Republican leaders have ignored call to strengthen the mine safety law and instead are pushing legislation that would gut OSHA enforcement.

The theme of this year's Workers' Memorial Day is "**Good Jobs, Safe Jobs, It's Time**" We urge you to get involved by attending this year's event. The key note speakers will be **Leo Gerard**, International President of the United Steelworkers and **Rose Trump**, President of the Labor History Society.

We will commemorate the 100th anniversary of Crystal Eastman's "Pittsburgh Survey", a landmark study in workplace safety and honor the impact women had on Workplace Safety.

Please join us on April 30, 2007, to honor the victims of workplace injury and illness and to keep on fighting for the promise of safe jobs for all workers.
